Program by Dr. Margrit Mikulis: Lyme, Pets and Prevention

Lyme disease has become a growing concern for outdoor enthusiasts as well as pet owners. With the geographic spread of this disease, animals and humans alike have an increased risk of exposure and infection. One of the unique aspects about Lyme is that it does affect humans as well as pets. There are also many similarities in symptoms in the two mammal groups.

Dr. Mikulis will discuss her clinical experience, the similarities and differences between human and pet Lyme disease, and prevention strategies. There will be an open discussion and ample time to ask questions.



Dr. Mikulis is a naturopathic doctor, and President of Living Natural, Inc., in Nashua NH. She owns a family medical practice and specializes in Lyme disease. She is currently finishing her training in Lyme disease through the International Physicians Training Program. She has a strong interest in Lyme awareness and dedicates her time to educating the community about the need for support in this area. As a recipient of the CALDA grant, she attended the prestigious 2008 International Conference on Lyme disease in San Francisco, sponsored by the International organization and the Lyme Disease Association.
